Priorities: First: Quaker aging service organizations. Second: Organizations in PA, NJ, NY that address needs of underserved aging adults. Priority given to direct care programs (not operations, planning, research, advocacy)

STRATEGIC GOALS FOR 2020-2024

1. Clarify what is meant by “impact”: vision, expectations
2. Develop an innovation fund strategy
 - a. Define a goal and process for creating innovation fund, including the possible use of RFPs
 - b. Identify areas of interest (Pandemic programming, intergenerational, LGBTQ, workforce, leadership, isolation, art and dementia, care coordination, quality of life, aging in place, youth engagement, equity, etc)
 - c. Identify amount to dedicate (\$ or %)
 - d. Define a way to evaluate success
3. Develop large grant strategy
 - a. Define goal and process for grant applications, including possible use of RFPs
 - b. Identify areas of interest: solicit suggestions from grantees, big ideas, collaborations
 - c. Identify amount to dedicate (\$ or %)
 - d. Define a way to evaluate success
4. Seek new grantees
 - a. Use networks, memberships
 - b. Join existing collaborations
 - c. Identify BIPOC-led organizations and organizations doing great Equity-Inclusion-Diversity work
 - d. Provide coaching assistance to inexperienced grant writers
 - e. Seek collaborations between multiple organizations in various sectors
 - f. Ensure that all grantees align with FFA values
5. Review policies and practices to align with social justice principles
 - a. Collect information about racial justice efforts of grantees
 - b. Consider ways to support their efforts
 - c. Review fund holdings, managers and policies
 - d. Review policies and practices of FFA and grantees to align with DEI principles
 - i. Collaboration
 - ii. Diversity of board, grantees and participants
 - iii. Listening to and including everyone
 - iv. Strive for equity
 - v. Actively working toward justice
6. Make policies and practices consistent with principles of trust-based philanthropy
 - a. Review application and report processes
 - b. Collect feedback on processes from grantees-simplify
 - c. Create guidelines around multi-year/repeat funding
 - d. Offer support beyond the \$
 - e. Good communication with grantees-transparent, responsive, know them
